## LOWESTOFT

LOWESTOFT is a bathing place, seaport, municipal borough, the seat of an extensive fishery, and a market town and parish, with a terminal station on the Great Eastern railway, 113 miles from London by road, 116 by rail via Ipswich and East Suffolk branch of the Great Eastern railway, and 149½ by rail via Norwich, 10 south from Yarmouth, 23½ south-east from Norwich, 10½ east from Beccles and 44 north-east from Ipswich, and is in the Northern division of the county and head of a county court district, in the union, hundred and petty sessional division of Mutford and Lothingland, rural deanery of Lothingland, archdeaconry of Suffolk and diocese of Norwich; the town stands upon the most easterly point of land in England, on a lofty eminence and commands an extensive view of the German Ocean

The progress of this place since the formation of the harbour and railway has been very rapid. A further impetus was given to the trade of the town on the construction of the East Suffolk section of the Great Eastern railway, which connects it with Ipswich, and forms a shorter route to London. A more direct line to Yarmouth was subsequently made via Marsh Junction, near St. Olave's, a distance of 14½ miles, but the interval of communication between the two towns has been greatly reduced by the opening, 13 July, 1903, of the Norfolk and Suffolk railway, jointly constructed by the Great Eastern, Great Northern and Midland Railway Cos which has intermediate stations at Corton, Hopton and Gorleston.

The harbour is formed by two piers, 1,300 feet in length, inclosing, with the old harbour, an area of 20 acres: at the extremity of each pier is a lighthouse, showing a red light from sundown to sunrise: a dock was opened in October, 1883, north of the north pier with entrance through the latter, and comprises between 19 and 20 acres: this dock, with its fish market, is for drift-net boats, and the old market is used for trawl-net boats. The trawl basin was extended in 1892 in a westerly direction, and now occupies the whole barrel plain, making the new trawl basin about double the size of the old one; this work became necessary owing to the large number of smacks fishing from Lowestoft: the inner harbour consists of a piece of water 2 miles in length, communicating with the river Waveney, by which merchandise can be conveyed to Beccles and Norwich: it has been of the greatest benefit to the coasting trade as a harbour of refuge, many lives and much property having been saved which otherwise would have been swallowed up in the waters of the German Ocean. Lowestoft is now an independent port; and in 1852 its limits were extended from League Hole to Thorpness and a legal quay appointed for fishing boats and their implements are distinguished by the letters L.T.; the Port Sanitary Authority was constituted by the Act 42 and 43 Vict c 103 (1879), and there is a Custom house.

On a point of land about 120 feet above the sea, to the north of the harbour, is the Upper Lighthouse, a circular tower, erected in 1676, rebuilt by order of the Trinity House in 1873, and opened on the 16th of February, 1874; it has a dioptric revolving light produced by a powerful lamp fixed in the centre of an octagonal drum of lenses, with a revolution every four minutes, showing a white light, visible for many miles, every half-minute; a fixed red light is thrown on to a buoy at the edge of Corton sand. On the Denes beneath stands the Low Lighthouse, which is an iron structure the light is occulted every half minute for the space of five seconds.

The herring fishery, for which this town has a growing reputation, begins about a fortnight before Michaelmas, and lasts till Martinmas, but a quantity of other fish are also brought here, and a considerable number of boats now frequent the port since the additional dock

and other facilities have been provided: before the commencement of the herring season many fishermen are employed in the mackerel fishery. The Fish Market consists of extensive ranges of buildings adjoining the two docks, where the fish are landed and sold by auction, and whence they are dispatched to the curing houses in the neighbourhood and to London and other parts by railway, lines of rail being laid across the streets into the market; there are, in fact, two markets, one solely for mackerel and herrings, and the other for white fish; and about 1,000 smacks belong to this port. The manufactures of the town consist of rope and twine; sailmaking, boat & ship building and coach building are also carried on and there are large oil and flour mills; timber, ice, coals, pickles and preserved meats &c. are imported. The total value of the imports of foreign and colonial merchandise into Lowestoft in 1910 was £77,239, and of exports £377,214, of which £371,499 was herrings.

In 1910 the number of vessels that entered the port with cargoes and in ballast in the foreign trade was 484 of 56,384 tons. The number cleared was 144 of 32,836 tons.

In the general coasting trade 1,104 vessels entered of 120,797 tons and 1,111 vessels of 130,667 tons cleared

The number of vessels registered as belonging to the port, under Part I. of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," in 1910 was 684, with a tonnage of 27,509; 808 boats, of 25,314 tons, were registered under Part IV. of the same Act, employing 4,821 men and boys to work them

The town was incorporated by Royal Charter, dated August 29th, 1885, and comprises the parishes of Lowestoft and Kirkley; the borough is divided into four wards; the corporation consists of a mayor, 8 aldermen and 24 councillors. A commission of the peace was granted to the borough 20 Sept. 1893.

By Local Government Board Order No. 31,872, part of Gunton civil parish was added to Lowestoft civil parish and municipal borough. In February, 1907, the parish of Kirkley was merged into the parish of Lowestoft for all except ecclesiastical purposes.

Lowestoft consists of the old and new towns; the former is very straggling, and being on an elevation has slopes and steps called "Scores" leading to the north beach. The declivity of the cliff here is covered with hanging gardens or terraces planted with trees and shrubs, and between these and the sea is a tract of land called "The Denes," with a large lake, golf and cricket grounds, and an extensive range of buildings appropriated to the curing of fish: the town is much frequented as a bathing place; the shore is composed of a firm sand, intermixed with shingle, and is very soft for bathing. The principal street of the old town is about a mile in length.

South Lowestoft, a modern extension, is in the parish of Kirkley for ecclesiastical purposes only: here the Esplanade, with its long row of semi-detached houses, commands a fine view of the sea, and the Marine parade and the Wellington esplanade are lined with houses of superior character, many of which are retained by county families for summer occupation. The Esplanade, 800 yards in length, and the South pier of the harbour, which it joins, form a promenade of great extent. Claremont Pier, 670 feet in length and 32 in breadth, was built by the Coast Development Co. Limited, and opened in May, 1903. The new and old towns are connected by a swing bridge across the harbour. Gas and water are supplied by the Lowestoft Water and Gas Company, established in 1853; the gas-works are on the beach; the water is derived from an inland lake at Bunker's Hill, in the parish of Lound, 5 miles north-west, and is pumped into a large covered

reservoir, north of the town, holding 8,000,000 gallons. Current for electric lighting is supplied by the Corporation.

The parish church of St. Margaret, half a mile west of the town, is a building of stone in the Perpendicular style, 184 feet in length and consisting of chancel, nave, aisles, porch with parvise over, at the west end of the south aisle, and a tower with spire, together 120 feet in height, and containing one bell; the tower, which is the oldest part of the church, dates from the first half of the 13th century: the nave, aisles, chancel and porch were built about 1483, and at this time the tower was raised and the spire, which is of wood, covered with lead, added: the length of the nave from the tower to where the rood screen anciently stood is 122 feet, and from thence to the east window 62 feet, making a total of 184 feet: on the east side of the porch are the remains of an old sundial, the ironwork of the gnomon still remaining: the entrance has some good groined vaulting, and a central boss carved with a representation of the Trinity: at the north-west angle of the tower is a long narrow opening, formerly used for storing processional crosses and banners: the tower arch is a very small one of the Decorated period: the font, though much mutilated, is a fine example of Perpendicular work: on the south side of the chancel are remains of a piscina and sedile: in the centre aisle is the grave slab of Thomas Scroope, a Carmelite friar, sometime Bishop of Dromore, in Ireland: he resigned the see in 1424, and died at Lowestoft in 1491, aged 100, and was buried in the middle of the chancel: the slab is 8 feet 7 inches long by 3 feet 6 inches wide and had a brass with three canopies and side buttresses and a figure of the bishop: the stained east window was erected in 1891 as a memorial to Mrs. Youngman: the principal portion of the south window in the chancel was painted by Robert Allen, a native of Lowestoft, and presented to the church by him in 1822: there is a memorial window to Lady Smith, who died in 1877, having nearly completed her 104th year; and others to Mrs. Reeve, Mrs. Richard Reeve and Mrs. Preston: the church was thoroughly restored and reseated in 1871, under the superintendence of Mr. J. L. Clemence F.R.I.B.A. at a cost of £5,000, when also an organ was erected at a cost of £475, and in 1899 the roof of the nave was decorated under the direction of Mr. G. F. Bodley A.R.A., F.S.A. The register, which is in excellent preservation, dates from 1561; bound up with it is a complete list of the incumbents of this parish from 1308 to the present time. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £400, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Norwich, and held since 1910 by the Rev. Edward Lowry Henderson M.A. of Oriel College, Oxford. St Peter's, a chapel of ease to St Margaret's, was built in 1833, at a cost of £3,250, and in 1903 a new chancel and a small side chapel with an organ chamber above it were added: the chapel affords 700 sittings, of which 400 are free.

The Mission chapel of the Good Shepherd was erected in 1909 at Oulton Corner, and will seat 200.

St. John the Evangelist's is an ecclesiastical parish, formed 19 Dec. 1854: the church, erected in 1853, at a cost of £5,600, on the south side of the harbour, is a building of Kentish rag and Caen stone, in the Decorated style, from designs by Mr. J. L. Clemence F.R.I.B.A. consisting of chancel, nave, transepts, aisle and tower at the north-east angle, with spire and an illuminated clock, placed in the tower in 1887: the aisle was added in 1883, at a cost of £900: there are several stained windows, including one erected as a memorial to the Rev. H. S. Hume, who died during his vicariate: a new organ was provided in 1904: the reredos was erected in 1899 as a memorial of the Diamond Jubilee of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria: there are about 1,000 sittings. The register dates from the year 1854. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £285, with residence, in the gift of the Church Patronage Society, and held since 1911 by the Rev. George Edward Weeks M.A. of Queens' College, Cambridge, B.D. of Durham University and LL.D. of Trinity College, Dublin. In 1900 a new vicarage house was provided on the sea front.

Christ Church is an ecclesiastical parish, formed 13 Nov. 1866: the church, erected on the Denes in 1868, at a cost of £1,460, as a memorial to the Rev. Francis Cunningham, a former vicar, is a structure of white brick, with stone facings, in the Early English style, standing north and south, and consisting of chancel, nave, aisles, south porch and a south-east tower with spire containing 6 bells: in 1879, a large vestry and an organ chamber with organ were added: in July, 1879, a new aisle was erected at a cost of £950: there are

about 750 sittings, of which 350 are free. The register dates from the year 1869. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £250, with residence, in the gift of five trustees, and held since 1912 by the Rev. Albert Hewitt.

The Catholic church, in Gordon road, dedicated to Our Lady Star of the Sea, was built in 1900-2, and opened in June, 1902: it is of red brick with stone dressings, in the Late Decorated style, and was erected at a cost of £10,000, from designs by Messrs R. Baines and Son, of London, and Mr. F. W. Richards M.S.A. of Lowestoft, joint architects, and consists of apsidal sanctuary with transeptal side chapels, a nave of five bays, aisles, south-west porch and an embattled tower with pinnacles at the north-west angle: the high altar and separate reredos of Caen stone and alabaster were erected at a cost of £750: the church affords 500 sittings: adjoining the church is a presbytery, erected at a cost of £1,250.

The Baptist Chapel, in London road, is an edifice of flint and brick, in the Gothic style, and was opened in Feb. 1899: the total cost amounting to £5,500; it consists of a nave and aisle, divided by red granite columns with carved stone caps and moulded bases: there is a fine organ, and the chapel affords sittings for 700 persons. In 1903 a new school-room was built at a cost of £2,500. There is a Particular Baptist chapel at Kirkley, erected in 1878. The Congregational chapel, London road, was first founded in 1655; the present edifice, erected in 1855, affords 764 sittings. The Wesleyan chapel, High street, built in 1862, is an edifice of white brick with Caen stone dressings in the Italian style, from designs by Mr. J. L. Clemence, and will seat 1,000 persons: in 1908 Sunday schools were erected at a cost of £4,000. The United Methodist chapel, in London road, built in 1878 at a cost of £8,200, is of brick and stone in the Italian style, from designs by Mr. John Johnson, architect, of London, and has a tower with spire, together 100 feet in height: there are 800 sittings.

The Primitive Methodist chapel, St. Peter's street, built in 1876, and enlarged in 1911, seats about 300. That in Mill road, erected in 1870, has 320 sittings, and there is another in Norwich road, built in 1872 and seating about 80. The Christian Meeting Room is in Chapel street. The Sailors' Bethel, Battery Green road, was built in 1899, and will hold about 1,000 persons.

A Cemetery of 15 acres, on the Beccles road, was formed in 1885, and enlarged by the addition of 3 acres in 1908, and contains a mortuary chapel; there is another cemetery of about 5½ acres in the London road, Kirkley; both are under the control of the Town Council.

The Town Hall, erected in 1857, and rebuilt in 1899, is a structure in the Italian style, with an illuminated clock and bell: the large hall is ornamented with pilasters, supporting a bold cornice and segmental decorated ceiling; three of the windows are filled with stained glass, presented by the late Sir Morton Peto bart.: that at the west end is intended to commemorate the union of France and England, during the Crimean war of 1854-6, and was designed by the late Mr. John Thomas, and includes in the centre a representation of the tournament of the Field of the Cloth of Gold, 7-25 June, 1520, with effigies of St. Denis of France and St. George of England; in the base are the respective shields of both nations, and the national flags, together with medallion portraits of H.M. the late Queen Victoria and H.R.H. the late Prince Consort, the Emperor Napoleon III. and the Empress Eugenie: the whole is surrounded by a rich bordering of roses and fleur-de-lis alternated: this window was exhibited at the Paris Exhibition, 1885: the two smaller windows contain respectively the arms of Sir Morton Peto bart. as lord of the manor, and the arms of the town of Lowestoft.

In 1899 the front of the old Town Hall having been taken down for the purpose of widening High street, some adjoining properties were purchased and the Town Hall and Municipal Offices facing Compass street rebuilt, under the direction of Mr. G. H. Hamby, the borough engineer, at a cost of about £4,000.

The market and rights were transferred to the corporation in 1887: the market place is in High street: the market is on Wednesday, and annual fairs are held on May 13 and Oct. 11 for small wares.

St Margaret's Church Institute, in Alexandra road, is now (1912) in course of erection, at an estimated cost of £5,000; the main hall will seat 700, and there will be club rooms for men and boys.

The premises of the Young Men's Christian Association were built in 1886, at a cost of £1,500, including furnishing, and contain a news room, library and a gym-

nasium. in 1902 an extra storey was added and the building refurnished throughout at a cost of £1,300. There is also a branch of the Young Women's Christian Association in Alexandra road.

The Carnegie Public Library, in Clapham road, built in 1904, and opened by Mrs. Tuttle on May 18th, 1905, is an edifice of red brick faced with white stone, and was erected at a cost of £6,000, given by Andrew Carnegie esq. of Skibo Castle, N.B. from the designs of Mr. G. W. Leighton, architect, of Ipswich; the reference library is a spacious room surmounted by a fine glass dome; the number of volumes in 1911 was over 9,000.

The Hippodrome is in Battery Green road.

The Royal Norfolk and Suffolk Yacht Club have their head quarters and club house at Lowestoft; the club now (1912) numbers about 400 members.

There are two Masonic Lodges here. St. Margaret's Lodge meets at the Royal Hotel on the second Monday in every month; the Unity Lodge, at the Royal Hotel, on the Thursday before full moon in each month; and the Royal Arch Chapter meets at the Royal Hotel on the fourth Tuesday in January, February, March, October and November.

The Territorial Force stationed in the town comprise a detachment of D Squadron Duke of York's Own Loyal Suffolk Hussars, Suffolk Yeomanry, the 1st Suffolk Battery 3rd East Anglian (Howitzer) Brigade Royal Field Artillery and E Co 4th Suffolk Regiment.

The County Police Station here was built in 1875.

There are hot and cold sea-water baths at South Lowestoft.

There are a number of ancient charities and six almshouses, built in 1838, for six of the poorest master fishermen of Lowestoft.

The Hospital, erected in 1881-2, at a cost, including site, of about £7,000, is a structure of red brick and stone in a plain Italian style, from designs by Mr. J. L. Clemence: the principal front towards the south is about 150 feet long and two stories in height: in the centre on the first story is an open arcade or verandah, intended for the use of convalescents: the dispensary for out-door patients is on the ground floor at the east end of the building, and is approached from Tennyson road: a children's wing and a nurses' wing have been added, and the building also comprises a waiting room, consulting room and board room. The Isolation Hospital for Infectious Diseases other than Small Pox, in Rotterdam road, was built in 1893, and enlarged in 1910, and contains 48 beds.

The Convalescent Home, near Belle Vue Park, was established in 1877, for persons of either sex likely to be benefited by sea bathing or a temporary residence at the seaside: it is primarily intended for Norwich, East Norfolk and East Suffolk, but is open to patients from other localities: there are beds for about 64 persons.

Belle Vue Park, on the summit of the cliffs, a short distance beyond the Upper Lighthouse, and opened in 1874, was formed out of what originally was an open heath, covered with gorse; several acres have been inclosed and tastefully laid out with paths and terraces and planted with flowers and shrubs, intermixed with the gorse, and the site affords fine views seawards. At the foot of the cliffs is a fountain, the water of which has medicinal properties. The Ravine Bridge, presented to the town by William Youngman esq. first Mayor of Lowestoft, and opened 29 Aug. 1887, is an elegant structure of red brick and ironwork, designed by Mr. R. Parkinson, engineer of the Eastern and Midlands railway, with a span of 70 feet, and an elevation of 30 feet from the ravine: the width between the rails is 7 feet; at the park end are two stones with inscriptions let into the brickwork.

Sparrow's Nest Park, sometimes called "Victoria Park," was purchased by the Corporation in 1897, and laid out in such a manner as to preserve the natural beauties of the site; about one-third of the total area consists of well-wooded grassy slopes, in which is a spring of mineral water; at the foot of these slopes is Sparrow's Nest House, formerly the residence of Baron Alderson and his daughter, the late Marchioness of Salisbury: attached is a small conservatory well stocked with flowers, and an extensive range of glass houses: during July, August and September, afternoon open-air concerts are

held daily, and two illuminated fêtes per month are given; a band also plays here three evenings per week during the season.

The area of the parish is 1,630 acres of land, 56 of tidal water and 47 of foreshore; rateable value, £147,716; the population in 1881 was 16,755; in 1891, 19,158; in 1901, 23,385; the population of the borough in 1891 was 23,347; in 1901 was 29,850, and in 1911, 33,777, viz.:—East ward, 5,788; North ward, 9,449; South ward, 9,404; West ward, 9,136.

The population of the ecclesiastical parishes in 1901 was: St. Margaret with St. Peter (parish church), 14,517; Christ Church, 2,152; St. John the Evangelist, 6,703.

KIRKLEY, otherwise South Lowestoft, adjoins Lowestoft, and commands a fine view of the German ocean. In February, 1907, the parish of Kirkley was merged into the parish of Lowestoft for all except ecclesiastical purposes. Claremont Pier, Kirkley, 670 feet in length, was built by the Coast Development Co. Limited, and opened May 30, 1903. Bathing is allowed in the season between 6.30 and 8.30 a.m. and 10.30 a.m. and 12.30 mid-day. The pier is open during the season from 6.30 a.m. to 10 p.m. and concerts are given each day. It is a favourite place for fishing during the autumn. The church of St. Peter, situated on a hill and serving as a landmark to mariners, after having lain in ruins since the time of the Protectorate, was partly rebuilt in 1750, and is an edifice of flint with stone facings, in a quasi-Perpendicular style, consisting of chancel, nave, aisles, north and south porches, side chapel and an embattled western tower 72 feet in height, containing one bell: in 1896 E. K. Harvey esq. presented a clock, which strikes the quarters and hours: in 1875 the nave was rebuilt and divine service resumed by the Rev. William Watson English D.D. rector (1875-85), and the restoration was completed by the Rev. Eustace Tennyson D'Eyncourt Jesse M.A. rector (1885-90), the church being enlarged by the erection of a side chapel, north aisle and north porch, and in 1887 a south porch was erected by Edward Kerrison Harvey esq. to the memory of his wife, and a brass with an inscription placed in it: at the same time a screen with well-carved figures, and a cross 7½ feet in height, was erected to her memory, a memorial brass being also placed by her daughters: in 1896 this screen was replaced by a handsome iron screen, the rood screen being re-erected in 1899 in St. Matthew's mission church: in the porch is a brass cross inscribed to the Rev. Francis Drocus Lempriere M.A. a former rector, d. 23 Oct. 1875, to whom there is also a memorial window, erected by his widow in 1887: a new organ has been erected, at a cost of £2,000, and a lectern presented by Edward Kerrison Harvey esq.: there are 1,100 sittings. The registers date from the year 1790, having been previous to this date incorporated with those of Pakefield. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £200, with 30 acres of glebe and residence, in the gift of the Rev. Henry Cockayne M.A. and held since 1911 by the Rev. Samuel Elsworth Cottam M.A. of Exeter College, Oxford. St. Matthew's Mission church, erected in 1899 in a poor and populous part of the parish, at a cost of upwards of £1,500, is a half-timbered structure, and seats 500 persons.

The Congregational chapel, erected in 1900-3 at a cost of £2,650, on a site given by the late Mr. J. J. Colman, from plans by Mr. George Baines F.R.I.B.A. architect, of London, is of red and white brick and stone, and consists of nave, transepts, and a square tower with lead spirelets and weather vane, and has a vestry in the rear: there are 400 sittings.

The Cemetery, 5½ acres in extent, was formed in 1880; it has two mortuary chapels, and is under the control of the Town Council acting as a Burial Board. An allotment of land, awarded at the time of the inclosure, now lets for £170 a year, which amount is distributed in coals to the poor, and helps to support provident clubs. There are many good lodging houses here. Mr. C. W. Willett is lord of the manor. The principal landowners are Messrs. Lucas Brothers, Thomas Hubbard Leggett esq. and John Wilson esq. The population in 1901 was 6,468.

**M**ARKET WESTON is a parish  $7\frac{1}{2}$  miles south from Harling Road station on the Thetford and Wymondham section and 9 west from Diss station on the Ipswich and Norwich line of the Great Eastern railway and 9 south-east from Thetford, in the North Western division of the county, Blackbourn hundred and petty sessional division. Thetford union and county court district, rural deanery of Blackburne, archdeaconry of Sudbury and diocese of E.y. The church of St. Mary is an ancient structure of flint, in the Early English and Decorated styles, consisting of chancel, nave, a fine Norman south porch and a square western tower with pinnacles and containing 5 bells and a clock: a new organ was placed in the church in 1888 and in 1889 the chancel was raised, a new vestry and belfry erected and a new font provided: there are 150 sittings. The register dates from the year 1567. The living is a discharged rectory, net yearly value £190, including 14 acres of glebe and residence, in the gift of trustees, and held since 1904 by the Rev. Rees Goring Morris B A. of Trinity College, Dublin. The Primitive Methodist chapel here was built in 1862. A charter for a market and fair here was obtained by Sir Robert Hovell, then lord of the manor, Dec 10th, 1263, but both are now extinct. The charities amount to £31 10s yearly. **M**ARLESFORD is a parish and village on the river Ore, over which there is a bridge of one arch, and is on the main road from Wickham Market to Saxmundham, with a station on the Framlingham branch of the Great Eastern railway,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  miles south-west from Saxmundham and 5 south-east from Framlingham, in the North Eastern division of the county, Loes hundred, Framlingham petty sessional division, Plomesgate union, Woodbridge county court district, rural deanery of Loes, Suffolk archdeaconry and Norwich diocese. The church of St Andrew stands on the north-west side of the village. It is a low building of flint with stone dressings, consisting of nave, south aisle, south porch and a western embattled tower supported by strong buttresses and containing 5 bells. There is a monument to the Alston family, bearing date 1641, and another to Lemuel Shuldharn, son of William Shuldharn esq. of Marlesford, cornet of the Scots Greys, who fell at Waterloo on the 18th June, 1815: there are 210 sittings; about half are appropriated, the remainder being free. The register dates from the year 1660. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £227, with 28 acres of glebe and residence

Weston Hall, now demolished, was formerly the seat of the ancient Bokenham family. Donald Charles Warnes esq. of Eye, is lord of the manor. The principal landowner is Samuel Death esq. The soil is mixed, subsoil, clay and gravel. The chief crops are wheat, barley, oats and turnips. The area is 979 acres; rateable value, £1,073; the population in 1911 was 193 in the civil and 246 in the ecclesiastical parish in 1901.

By Local Government Board Order 19,038, Weston Hindle was transferred from Market Weston to Thelthetham in 1886.

Post Office—Thomas Taylor, sub-postmaster. Letters through Thetford arrive at 6 30 a m. & 6 p m.; despatched at 8 20 a m. & 6.5 p m., sundays, 10.15 a.m. The nearest money order & telegraph office is at Hopton, 2 miles distant.

Public Elementary School (mixed), a brick building erected in 1873, at the expense of a late rector & landowners, at a cost of £214, for 54 children; average attendance, 30; Miss Sylvia Violet Collins, mistress. Carriers from Hopton to Bury St Edmunds, pass through wed. & sat

near the church, in the gift of Arthur Heywood esq. and held since 1894 by the Rev Charles William Houlbrook M A of Queens' College, Cambridge. The only charities are—that of £6 yearly from Sir Walter Devereux, left in 1620 for the poor, payable out of an estate belonging to the Shuldharn family, Joseph Kersey left £833 1s 1d to the parishes of Charsfield, Dallinghoo, East Soham and Marlesford; and 1s. weekly, from the late John Smith, left January 29, 1693, for giving 12 small loaves away at the church on Sundays. Marlesford Hall, a plain mansion of brick standing in a small park near the church, is now the residence of Capt. C. S. Schreiber J P. The chief landowners are the Schreiber family, who are lords of the manor, the Earl of Guilford and Arthur Heywood esq. of Glevering Park. Here are sandpits. The common land in this parish was enclosed in the year 1877. The soil is mixed; subsoil, clay and sand. The chief crops are wheat, roots, barley and hay. The area is 1,294 acres of land and 7 of water; rateable value, £1,797; the population in 1911 was 388.

Parish Clerk, William Messenger
